LEMONS AS BATTERIES AND OTHER LESSONS *IBM Researchers to Visit AMD for National Engineers Week*

(OSSINING, NY) – Eighth grade students at the Anne M. Dorner Middle School will learn how 9 million lemons can power a car during a “Lemons as Batteries” lesson offered by IBM researchers who will visit the school on Monday, February 25, in celebration of National Engineers Week. Seventh grade students will investigate how to build a bridge out of a single sheet of 8.5” by 11” paper. Groups of students whose paper bridges hold the most weight will be given special items as prizes.

Several members of the Mercy College STEP organization will accompany the 10 IBM researchers during the visit. The STEP program shares a common goal with IBM of attracting more youth to the math and science disciplines.
